## **ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2018-19**

On 30<sup>th</sup> April 2018, the annual General body Meeting of the Ashryadhama Anatha Makkla Ashrama and Rural Development Society was held at its Head Office under the Chairmanaship, the President- Smt. Kamalamma. All invited members of the organization were present at the meeting. The Secretary Mr. Thippeswamy presented the annual report of the organization for the period 2018-19

Following are the highlights of the activities carried out during the reporting period.

## A. Children Programmes:-



 During the reporting the organization had 25 orphan children drawn from 5 talukas of Chitradurga District. These children were given residential facilities with food, shelter, health care, Educational aid, sports and cultural activities, yoga and mediation and other related service. Out of 25 children 5 children did not have both the parents and 20 had single parents. Of them 15 were boys and 10 were girls, of 6 to 12 years age Communities, These women have made a total saving of Rs. 2,16,000 also 30 groups have mobilisedbank loan for various income generation activities. 50 SHGs have mobilized loan from Sangamitra financial Institutions for income generation, children education, agricultural development, health and other purpose.

- 4. A one day public rally and public meeting was organized at Chitradurga 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2019 on the occasion of International women day inviting the leaders from the local and the district level. They discussed on the various issues pertaining to the women, including women reservation bill and domestic violence.
- 5. Programs were held on the occasions of International anti child labour day (12<sup>th</sup> June 2018 to 14<sup>th</sup> November 2018 (Childrens day) in order to educate and empower the children and the community on the rights of the children and defend children rights.
- 6. The organization has been actively participating with the SPIN network in order to facilitate the empowerment of the dalits, minorities women and other marginalized classes and the development of various people based initiative through the creation of a network that would build on the strengts of existing organizations and improve capacities of the initiatives. SPIN is presently active across 6 talukas of the District.
- 7. The staff and the volunteers of the organization also participated in various workshops and conventions organized on diverse issues including NREG, Child rights, worker rights at the District, State and National levels.



 On 28<sup>th</sup> March 2019, a training was conducted to Women regarding awarness in self employment.



8. The Senior staffs have been invited as resource persons to train the staff and SHGs, Children's clubs by other NGOs in the District.

9. During the reporting period Rs. 5,42,800/- was received from local donors and Management committee.

10. The organization remains thankful to all the people and the institution for the co-operation and support being extended for successfully conducting the above activities.
